Dr. Stephen A. Wagner Re-Elected as Director of Prosthodontic Practice & Patient Care Division Albuquerque Prosthodontist to Serve Three More Years on ACP Board of Directors



CHICAGO – <u>Stephen A. Wagner, DDS, FACP</u>, has been re-elected to serve a second term as Director of the Prosthodontic Practice and Patient Care Division for the Board of Directors of the American College of Prosthodontists (ACP), the national organization representing the dental specialty of prosthodontics.

"Private practitioners' needs are centered around direct patient care, their relationship with third party providers, and an understanding of the evolving scope of practice of prosthodontics in the private practice setting," said Dr. Wagner. "I feel that the Prosthodontic Practice and Patient Care Services Division, in many ways, is their voice."

Under Dr. Wagner's leadership, the Division was recently responsible for refining diagnostic and treatment insurance codes, developing salable and educational products sold by the ACP, and overseeing the creation of the <u>Glossary of Digital Dental Terms.</u>

Dr. Wagner has maintained a private practice in Albuquerque, New Mexico for nearly

40 years, and is also involved in clinical research centered around work simplification in prosthodontics. His dental images have been used by the *New York Times, ABC News, The Discovery Channel, Newsweek,* and the American Dental Association (ADA). His research also led him to create the Wagner Impression Tray, which simplifies the process of taking impressions of patient's teeth and gums.

Dr. Wagner is a Fellow of the ACP and Diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics. He received his DDS from the University of Southern California School of Dentistry, and completed his prosthodontic training at MD Anderson Hospital in Houston, Texas.

A prosthodontist is a dental specialist who focuses on the restoration and replacement of missing teeth and correcting other oral or facial issues. With their advanced training, prosthodontists are able to help patients with implants, dentures and veneers, all the way to full mouth and jaw reconstructions.
